Eligibility

Gifts are given

- to students with United Church membership in East Central Ontario Region;
- who have been recognized by the national United Church Office of Vocation as Candidates for Ordered Ministry (Ordained or Diaconal);
- and who are in full or parttime studies in an MDIV or equivalent program;
- for a maximum of three years of studies (not necessarily consecutive).

Gifts are not given when either studies or participation in the Candidacy Pathways process has been suspended.

These gifts are given in recognition of the additional commitments students make.

Students may use them in any way that supports them on their pathway to ministry.

Process

- No application is needed.
- The ECOR UCW Treasurer receives in confidence, from the Office of Vocation, names of Candidates engaged in studies, then checks her UCW records of the number of years a student has received a gift.
- The amount of the gift may vary each year.
 Designated funds available are shared equally among students, up to a maximum per student set by the regional UCW executive.
- Students receive a cheque and letter explaining the gift and their option to return gifts not wanted.
- Gifts are made in March or later, after names are received from the Office of Vocation.

Confidentiality & Communication

- The ECOR UCW Treasurer holds names of recipients in confidence.
- Only the amount given and number of recipients are reported to the UCW.
- General information about this support for students may be shared with the ECORC Assembly of Elders or others for recruiting and encouraging students.
- The ECOR UCW Treasurer may share students' messages of thanks (without identifying information).
- The ECOR UCW Treasurer may invite a recipient to a ECOR UCW Annual Meeting to describe the student experience and express appreciation on behalf of students for gifts received.
