Call to Order

Rev. Wanda Stride, Speaker of the Assembly of Elders and Chair for this meeting, called the meeting to order at 10 am.

Land Acknowledgement

Rev. Rodney Smith-Merkley, Minister for Respectful Relationship and Indigenous Justice, led the land acknowledgement: (Loyalist Township) Ancestral lands of the Haudenosaunee [Hoe-den-o-shown-ee], Mississauga [Mi-chi Sawgeeg(soft)], and Omámíwinini [O-maw-mee-wi-nini] Peoples. The lands we are on today are recognized in the Two Row Wampum, Dish with One Spoon Treaty, Treaty 27, and the Crawford Purchase.

Welcoming to the Land

Patricia Roebuck introduced (Grand Mother Kate), Kathy Brant indigenous elder, who welcomed delegates to the land.

Teaching Moment

Kathy Brant (Grand Mother Kate) introduced herself in her native language and shared some of her personal background. Grand Mother Kate highlighted the 'Walking the Path of Peace Together' which is a communal project that is in collaboration with Faith United Church in Kingston. Many delegates, on the day prior to the general meeting, participated at an information session on these communal and sacred grounds. Grand Mother Kate also shared an indigenous teaching: 1. 'Times of Gathering' gathering: When the big dipper is emptying in mid-winter, is a time of giving thanks for gifts of harvest. 2. 'Great Law of Peace': Carrying the great peace; the great peace is the derivative a great empathy – always protect your own personal peace, to bring to others.

Response to Welcome

Rev. Wanda Stride provided an explanation for why land acknowledgement precedes formal gathering, provided a reminder regarding voting on Remit 1: Establishing an Autonomous National Indigenous Organization, drew delegates attention to a reconciliation quilt that had been gifted to the regional council as a piece for reflection.

Words of Constitution/Instructions

Rev. Wanda Stride called the meeting to order:

In the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, the only Sovereign head of the Church, and by the authority of the East Central Ontario Regional Council of the United Church of Canada, I hereby declare this fall general meeting duly constituted and to be in session for conducting the business which will properly come before it.

Welcome from Host Congregation Emmanuel United Church

Rev. Phil Wilson welcomed all in attendance to Emmanuel United Church, and highlighted some housekeeping items, like access to washrooms, emergency exits, and where and how lunch would be served.

Opening Motion

CARRIED**Celebration of Ministry Service/ Welcome from Host (Emmanuel United Church)**

The Celebration of Ministry Service was held in the Sanctuary at Emmanuel United Church, situated in Odessa Ontario, and began at 10:45 AM. Tom Reynolds performed the prelude. The officiants included, the Executive Minister, Rev. Éric Hébert-Daly; the Speaker, Assembly of Elders, Rev. Wanda Stride; the Moderator of The United Church of Canada and General Council Guest, The Right Reverend Dr. Carmen Lansdowne; the Vocational Minister – Candidacy Pathway for East Central Ontario, Eastern Ontario Outaouais and Nakonha:ka Regional Councils, Rev. Caroline Penhale; the Pastoral Relations Minister, Rev. Darren Liepold; the Minister for the hosting congregations (Emmanuel United Church, Odessa), Rev. Phil Wilson; and Musician, Tom Reynolds.

Following the Prelude, the officiants and candidate entered the sanctuary to the processional hymn 'Joyful Joyful We Adore You' (VU 232). The service opened with words of welcome, the call to worship, the lighting the Christ Candle, the prayer of approach, and the anthem 'Come O Fount Of Every Blessing' (arranged and performed by Tom Reynolds and Wanda Stride). The Scripture reading was John 21: 1-19, 25, and the theological reflection, called 'A-Ha!' was shared by Rev. Dr. Bill Smith (former Executive Secretary of Bay of Quinte Conference). Following the reflection, the hymn 'I The Lord of Sea and Sky' (VU 509) was sung. The offertory was followed by the hymn "For the Gift of Creation" (VU 538), and a offertory prayer led by Rev. Dr. Bill Smith. This was followed by the singing of hymn 'O Holy Spirit' (VU 200).

The Celebration of Ministries began with the reciting of Our Affirmation of Faith. The candidate was presented by Rev. Caroline Penhale, Vocational Minister, Candidacy Pathway and the Regional Council was asked for its pledge of support. Following the declaration of vows, the laying on of hand was administered along with the placing of the stole. The candidate was presented with a Bible, a certificate, a chalice and paten, a gift from the regional council youth, and a prayer shawl. Following this, all in attendance responded with Halle, Halle, Halle (VU 958). The Ordinand:

The Holy Communion liturgy was led by The Right Rev. Dr. Carmen Lansdowne, The Moderator of The United Church of Canada, and included a call, the singing of hymn 'Bread for the Journey' (MV 202), the great thanksgiving, the remembrance and blessing, the reciting of The Lord's Prayer, sharing of the elements, and the prayer following Communion.

The Celebration of Ministry Service concluded with a closing benediction, followed by the recessional hymn 'Let All Things Now Living' (VU 242). The Postlude was performed by Tom Reynolds.

A reception and catered lunch were served in the Church's hall.

Special Announcement

The Chair announced that vandalism had occurred within the regional council. Trinity-St. Andrew's United Church, Brighton had painted its steps the colors of the rainbow, after celebrating a formal recognition as an affirming congregation, but vandals dropped black paint over the rainbow. The incident was heart wrenching, but following the incident, the community showed its support by coming together to help restore the rainbow-colored

stairs. The incident help to create awareness, and garner further support for protecting the LGBTQIA2+ community.

Recognition and Covenanting with Licensed Lay Worship Leaders (LLWLs)

Cathy Gradante, Cheryl McMurry and Rev. Eric Hebert-Daly (Executive Minister) led a liturgy that covenanted with License Lay Worship Leaders within the regional council who had been relicensed. The service included, introductions of LLWL, reading from Scripture (Corinthians 12), prayers of thanksgiving, vows, and concluding prayers.

Facilitation Leadership Team

Rev. Phil Wilson, introduced members of the Facilitation Leadership Team, shared its mandate withing the regional council, and highlighted a new checklist and score card being created which will help any gathering/meeting become more equitable. The Equity Leadership Team invited members of the regional council to call upon its guidance as needed.

Canada Emergency Business Account (CEBA) Loan

Ted Meyers shared that the repayment of the CEBA loan (originally \$60,000) has been reduced to \$40,000 if paid before January 18th 2024. If full repayment was not rendered by then, 5% interest on loans \$60,000 will begin. The United Church of Canada has made available loans of \$40,000 at a rate of 5% interest, to enable CEBA loan recipients to pay down the loan before the January 18th deadline.

Nominations Leadership Team

Rev. Mary-Jane Hobden, Chair, highlighted some of the work the Nominations Leadership Team has undertake, and moved the following motion:

Candidacy Pathway How Do We Accompany Our Candidates?*7 Phases Of The Candidacy Pathway*

- Calling Forth: intentionality by the church in raising up leaders
- Identify: naming a sense of call
- Accompany: support along the way
- Equip: Credentialing (education) and Competency (Supervised Ministry Education, field placements)
- Assess: promise, suitability, readiness
- Authorize: as ready for ministry leadership
- Celebrate: ordination/commissioning and every achievement and discernment along the way

Accompany

- When as individual, who is active in a UCC community of faith has discerned a call to the vocation of ministry in The United Church of Canada, that individual may apply online to the Office of Vocation to meet with a Candidacy Board to engage in an assessment of promise and suitability for ministry.
- The Candidacy Board walks with the individual through the interview process to assess and give feedback and offering direction regarding next steps along the way.
- As an individual moves along the pathway, the Church continues to accompany and walk with the individual through the connection with the Candidacy Board.
- Candidates must be able to demonstrate that they have the capacity to receive support for ministry leadership. Possible Forms for this Support: 1. A Circle of Accompaniment: formed to encourage, support and nurture those identified as having promise for ministry leadership or who have been named as candidates and to foster an environment of on-going discernment. 2. Diaconal ministry candidates: receive support through the program requirements with the Centre for Christian Studies, including a diaconal mentor.
- One stage of the Candidacy Pathway for those in the ordained stream involves Supervised Ministry Education (SME).
- The SME offers the candidate a chance to both practice ministry and reflect upon their practice of ministry with the support of a supervisor and circle of accompaniment.
- Each candidate is responsible for finding an SME appointment using the same Church Hub process that ministry personnel use to search for a call or appointment.
- Once a match is made, both Regional Pastoral Relations and the Candidacy Board must approve the appointment (note also that the Region approves a pastoral charge as an SME site before they can post a profile on Church Hub).
- SME Roles & Responsibilities: Candidacy Board - some boards have a liaison on the board assigned to each candidate. This is a practice the Quebec and East Ontario Candidacy Board plans to adopt soon; 2. a trained Educational Supervisor facilitates the candidate's learning through meeting regularly for reflective practice on, and oversight of, learning goals, practice of ministry, and growth in pastoral identity and provides candidacy boards with a fulsome report from of a candidate's competence for practice of ministry 3. The Community Of Faith through the Community Of Faith Connection (CFC), provides candidacy boards with responses to evaluative questions on suitability for ministry based on the standards of practice for ministry. 4. Ministry & Personnel is responsible to ensure that: a) the candidate is welcomed and well-situated b) the community of faith and candidate covenant to be in ministry together c) the pastoral relations policies regarding oversight and accountability of ministry personnel are followed.
- SME: Candidate Responsibility: 1. While the context is one of support, there is also a self-directed quality to the Candidacy Pathway. 2 .A candidate has responsibility for attending to their process, and being in communication with the CFC, the Educational Supervisor, the Vocational Minister and the Candidacy Board as needed. 3 If ever a candidate is ever unclear where to turn, their primary resource person is a Vocational Minister.

- Boundaries Training and Policies: 1. Mandatory Boundaries Training – all candidates entering SMEs are required to have completed Boundaries training provided by the Office of Vocation through ChurchX. 2. This is the same training that all ministry personnel required to complete and update every 5 years. 3. Participants are introduced to the following UCC policies: Workplace Discrimination Harassment and Violence and Sexual Misconduct Response Policy and Procedures. 4. These policies are intended to help keep everyone working and serving in a UCC environment safe and to provide guidance as to what to do if there is an issue. 5. If ever a candidate, has a question about a matter covered by either of these policies, or wonders if they do, they should contact is a Vocational Minister.

-Throughout the SME, if a candidate has a question on which they need to consult, they can and should contact me, as the Vocational Minister. If I am away, another Vocational Minister would be able to answer in my place.

-In addition, because an SME is also a form of ministry appointment, candidates can direct pastoral relations or employment related questions to the Pastoral Relations Minister.

United Church Women

Cheryl Mound, President of UCW, shared various highlights, including, supporting students through bursaries, providing support to El Salvador, supporting new mothers and babies in Regina, recognizing, and appreciating the work of Trevor White with Camp Quimolac, holding UCW gatherings at Camp Quimolac, hosting book clubs, and continuing to connect with many people.
